

# LET'S CONTINUE TO FOLLOW THE RULES AND STAY SAFE!

By now we are all accustomed to the many rules that must be followed in the interests of having a COVID safe community. We all share this responsibility, and there are a number of important actions we must undertake below:

- 1. If a student or staff member is unwell they should not attend school at all. Anyone with cold/flu symptoms needs to stay home until the symptoms are completely gone. There can be no exceptions to this.
- 2. Our students and staff continue to undertake regular hand washing/sanitising, up to 5-8 times per day. This includes when they arrive at school, before eating and before/after play times.
- 3. Children are not required to wear masks at school, although they may do so at the discretion of their parents. Staff are not required to wear masks while working in the
- 4. Social distancing between adults is vital, and our staff will be practising this routinely. Parents also need to social distance in and around our school fence lines, and we ask respectfully that parents do not congregate in groups.

# PRINCIPAL'S THOUGHTS

We've had a short week, this with the cup day holiday and another week with lots of students reconnecting to learning, friends and being back at school. It is terrific to have the kids back and it has been a very busy time for them here too.

#### PLEASE READ - Safe out the Front

Again I find myself having to talk about many people again putting themselves and others at risk at pick up time. I was very saddened to see the number of people, with their children walking across the very busy road in front of the school. I personally spoke to 5 different people asking them to please use the crossing which is provided for the safety of parents and students. In such very different times in our community I find it very frustrating to have to continue to talk about Parent behaviour at the front of the school and whilst it is only the few, it puts us all at risk.

The following are a must and can I please ask all parents to make sure they understand what I need you to do:

Do not stand directly at the front of the school waiting for your child. Social distancing is required and we are asked by the Education Department to have parents waiting at their vehicles. We have extra staff on duty to support our younger children at this time of the day.

Masks MUST be worn and social distancing MUST be adhered to.

Smoking is NOT permitted within the school grounds or within 4 metres of the school fence (this is government legislation)

I am very worried about the danger that some of our children are being exposed to by crossing the road with parents, **NOT** using the crossing and dangerous driving practice.

Please remember to make sure to use the crossing! It is there to get across the road safely and that cars stop for school children.

It is illegal to do a hook turn over the double white lines at the front of the school. This puts others in danger.

The bus pick up zone is for buses only. There is ample parking at the front of the school and in the area for our families

I am asking any of our students and parents that see people acting unsafe, please remind them of the correct way and refer it to me. I will continue to be out the front ensuring we are all acting in a safe manner.

9<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> November.


Unfortunately parents will not be able to attend the Fair due to Covid restrictions.


