As a parent this is your opportunity to support the development of your child's **Individual Education Plan (IEP)**.

You will have the opportunity to have our **Visible Learning Walls** for Literacy and Numeracy explained, a journey of learning where your child tracks where they are in the learning cycle of *"What I know"*, *"What I am learning now"* and *"What I am learning next"*.
