

# Kiss 'n' Go <u>NOT</u> Safe

Dear Parents,

Unfortunately this Friday 16<sup>th</sup> Oct will be the last access you will have to use our Kiss 'n' Go for the foreseeable future. Unfortunately after a meeting with Mildura Rural City Council we have deemed this action by the school to support you at pick up and drop off to be NOT safe. The area is putting many people at risk due to drivers outside the gate acting in an unsafe way; hook turning, overtaking and double parking, now means we MUST shut this down.

Mark Rogerson and I met with council early in the week after a number of complaints were fielded from the public about the end of the day situation and from this meeting we have proposed a number of options that would support us further eg. Changing the parking along Ontario to 14<sup>th</sup> street to a Clear Way between 2 – 4. However as these are longer term options we have no alternative but to close this area.

To help with pick up time we will now re-open our side gate from 3:15 – 3:30pm to allow students to exit through to Olympic Way and Cavallo Drive.

I do appreciate that this is not good news for the majority of people who have been acting appropriately and safe but I can assure you I will continue to work with MRCC to make this easier out the front.



## **PRINCIPAL'S THOUGHTS**

A great week at our amazing school and it is terrific to see the happy smiling faces of our students arriving every day in full school uniform, with hat organised and ready to learn about the world. We have also been so impressed with the focussed way students have settled back into their learning and the positive approach shown. Catching up with friends has certainly been a highlight. We are looking forward to an excellent term of teaching and learning with some fun events planned.

As with the last time, the Department of Education & Training has instructed schools that **parents must stay 'outside the fence'.** We're sure you, like us, feel a little sad, even compromised by this rule. After all the daily interactions between staff and parents are so crucially important to us all. However this COVID-19 Safety Strategy enables our students and staff to be safe at school, so I'm sure we all agree it is a temporary sacrifice worth making.

For the next little while our focus has been sharpen to include **DET's latest three state-wide priorities that include: Mental Health & Wellbeing; Learning; and Transition.** Across this week, we have a clear plan that works on translating these priorities into actions.

By now we are all accustomed to the many rules that must be followed in the interests of having a COVID safe community. We all share this responsibility, and there are a number of important actions we must undertake below:

If a student or staff member is unwell they should not attend school at all. Anyone with cold/flu symptoms needs to stay home until the symptoms are completely gone. There can be no exceptions to this.
Our students and staff continue to undertake regular hand washing/ sanitising, up to 5-8 times per day. This includes when they arrive at school, before eating and before/ after play times.

3. Children are not required to wear masks at school, although they may do so at the discretion of their parents. Staff are not required to wear masks while working in the classroom, but must wear masks at other times.

4. Social distancing between adults is vital, and our staff will be practising this routinely. Parents also need to social distance in and around our school fence lines, and we ask respectfully that parents do not congregate in groups.

Many thanks in advance for supporting our COVID Safe Plan, and helping make Ranfurly Primary School a safe community.

Please <u>do not</u> keep your child at home on really hot days. We have terrific air conditioning in all classrooms and the temperature in the rooms is between 21-24°C during lessons. Importantly on days forecasted 38°C or over our students do not go outside but stay in their 'cool' classrooms during recesses. Secondly, we are a Sun Smart School and it is great to see all those blue broad-brimmed hats on their heads during outside play.

We have a Public Holiday on Friday 23 October 2020, scheduled originally on the eve of the AFL Grand Final and now called 'Thank You Day'. Ranfurly will be closed on Friday 23 October 2020.

Thank you once again parents, carers and other family members, for your cooperation, your patience, your goodwill and your strength.

### WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst all parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All parents who have access to our Compass Portal will be able to participate in this year's survey. The instructions will be added as a news item to Compass (same as the newsletter). All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year, the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 12 October** to **Friday 13 November**.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

# Book Club






