SNAKES PRESENT IN AREA

Snakes have recently been spotted near school. Please be careful when out and about, especially in areas with longer grass on warmer days.

There are a few things that you can do to stay safe:

Stay vigilant

If you see a snake, stay still or move in the opposite direction

Do not try and catch or kill a snake

Reduce the chance of a snake visiting your backyard by getting rid of outdoor rubbish piles, don't leave food scraps around and keeping lawns short

Snakes are protected and it is illegal to catch or kill the reptiles
