#### PRINCIPAL'S THOUGHTS

At the time of writing my report, my thoughts go out to all families who have been greatly affected by the ongoing flood crisis across Victoria and New South Wales, with a number of schools being required to return to remote learning.

In conjunction with the Department's School Operations Guide and Safety Management Plan, please see the following updates and changes to COVID-19 regulations for our school;

It is strongly recommended that **students**:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- should not attend school after 5 days if still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school
- advise the school of the COVID-19 positive test result

Where **students** become symptomatic at school they should:

- be collected by their parents/carers
- undergo testing for COVID-19
