Dear Parents/Guardians,

Ranfurly Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of the school's voluntary financial contributions for 2025.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum, and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES




Parents Club Christmas Raffle
