LEARNING TALKS

As stated in previous newsletters, next Wednesday evening and Thursday we are conducting our new 'Learning Talks'. Thank you to all of our families who have made a time through our online booking system. Please note that Thursday 6th of May will be a <u>Pupil Free Day</u> to support the running of our Learning Talks. Students and their parents <u>will only</u> attend school for their appointment time. We are looking forward to seeing you at our Learning Talks.

NAPLAN

Beginning on Tuesday the 11th of May, Year 3 and 5 students will be participating in NAPLAN (National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy). Our students will be completing the paper assessments this year. An information leaflet has gone home with your child today.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The assessment provides parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum.
