Xander's goal was to get himself organised in the morning. He asked his parents for an alarm clock.



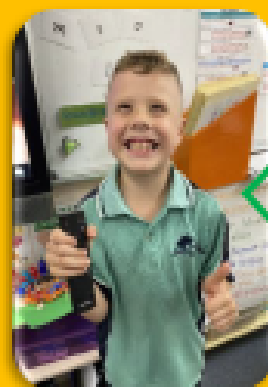
Piper's goal was to pack all of her toys away. She always went back to her room each night to check.

BOOK FAIR ~ BOOK FAIR ~ BOOK FAIR

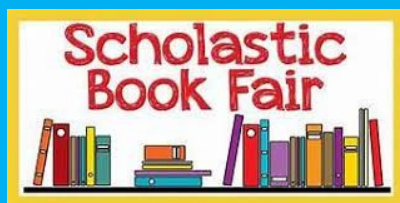
Our annual Scholastic Book Fair will be held in the Library from 17th – 21st May.

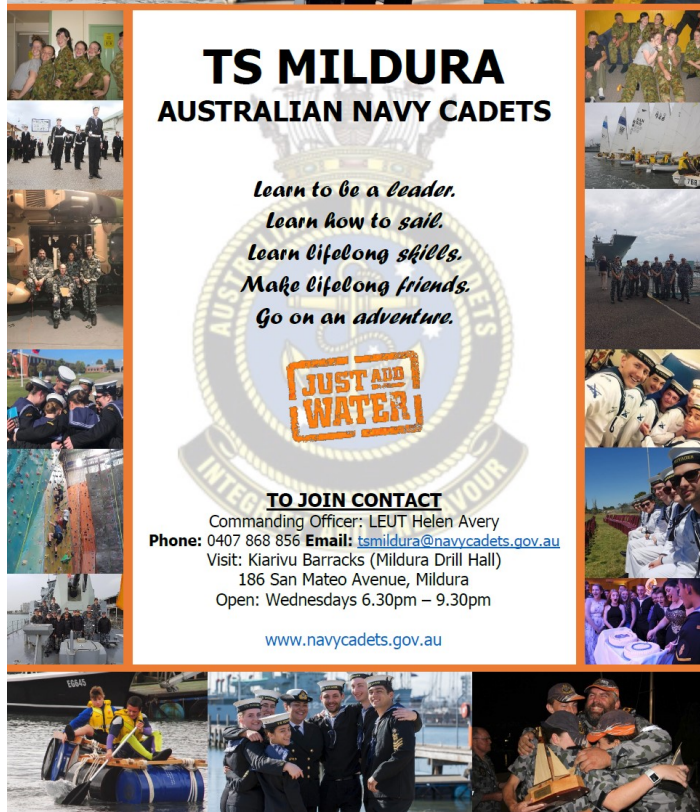
